SAINT VINCENT - (Agit). - The children's revolution has been a great success in Saint Vincent. Ivo Gal, the child Mayor, assumed his powers - Agit reports - to be his until the evening of February 26. During the days of the children's carnival everyone behaved very well and things went smoothly, without the interference of adults. There were parades of floats, and groups in costume, children's shows, masquerade races, and the traditional "fagiolata" with polenta for all. The Head of the Guards Ernestino De Marie and his aids kept an eye on automobile traffic. The cars had to obey very low speed limits or face charges in the children's court. The Judge in charge Richiardi was ready to dole out severe punishments to lawbreakers. 1962 A GOOD TOURIST YEAR FOR NAPLES

NAPLES - (Agit). - The tourist who visited Naples and its surrounding areas staying in hotels and pensions numbered in 1962 1,406,316, of which 911,168 were Italian and 495,148 foreign. The number of days spent there and in the other towns within the province of Naples amounted to 3,918,607, with an increase of 215,747 as compared to 1961. In the larger hotels of the entire province there were registered 95,448 guests with a total of 1,619,853 days spent. Altogether - Agit notes - there were registered a total of 1,619,853 guests visiting a total of 538,460 days, with an increase of respectively 2.1% and 4.4% as compared to 1961. Among the foreigners the most were Americans with 145,000 arrivals and 375,000 days visited, followed in number by Germans, English, and French. (Agit)

TALKS ON PALERMO BY GAETANO FALZONE

PALERMO - (Agit). - Professor Gaetano Falzone of the University of Palermo and Secretary-General of the "Return to Sicily" Committee will hold a series of talks in the Italian Institute of Culture care of the "Dante Alighieri" Committees of Austria and Hungary. In particular - says Agit - Professor Falzone will speak in Vienna, Graz, Linz, and Wells in Austria, and in Budapest in Hungary. The theme to be heard will be "Palermo: Mediterranean City". At Budapest Prof. Falzone, who is the author of special studies about those Hungarians who were part of Garibaldi's Army, will speak on this topic in the University, as part of the history of Sicily's liberation by Garibaldi. The Palermo lecture will be accompanied by the showing of a noted documentary film, which Agit's Director has already shown in the English edition to many Italo-Americans of Sicilian origin during his trip to north America. NEWS IN ITALIAN TELEVISION

ROME - (Agit). - A series of new programs have been prepared recently for the 1st and 2nd channels of the Italian television RAI-TV. Among the variety shows is "Music Hotel" directed by Enzo Trapani. The show in a series of eight will take place in a big hotel which will, from time to time, have famous guests of the popular music, show and theater world. On the other hand, the show "Small Theaters Italian-Style", a kind of musical notebook, will be presented by Giorgio Gaber in thirteen programs. Each presentation will have as its background a typical Italian stage set: an outdoor trattoria, a scene along the Tiber or the Arno Rivers, and so on. After the end of "Studio One" Zizi Jeanmaire will be the lead in "Paris Calling", a show to be divided in five weekly programs with French entertainers such as Gilbert Becaud, Juliette Greco, and others. Also returning soon to TV will be the team of Garinei and Giovannini who are preparing a series of musical shows about Rome at the end of the last century to be interpreted by Nino Manfredi and Aldo Fabrizi.
