Dear Prof. Falzone,

I am sorry that I did not answer your letter of 25,5,1978 any  
sooner. We had to think out the material for the commemorative volume of  
Neo-Hellenika, very carefully.

This is what the editor Dr. Proussis and prof. Papadopoulos of the Cyprus  
Research Center, have decided. Your article should be confined  
to the edition, with a minimum commentary of Garibaldi's 20 unpublished  
letters, which lines with Dr. Arnakis's later interest in the Greek  
War of Independence and his documentary finds from American Archives.  
It is apt that this Italian evidence be published by an Italian scholar.  
We do not advise however, a longer treatment covering Victor Emmanuel's  
efforts at installing his son Amedeo to the throne of Greece. This is  
a theme of minor importance which does not, in our view, enhance the  
interest of the commemorative volume.

I propose that you send us a short resume of your article, as soon as  
you can. Have in mind that we would like to go to print at the end of  
1979, God willing.

The overall theme of this journal has not yet been determined, but we are thinking along the lines of devoting it to topics dealing with modern Greek history, particularly covering the period of the War of Independence, and modern Greek literature. We leave it up to you.

Please let us know of your ideas and we can begin planning the scope of this next, and perhaps final, volume of Neo-Hellenika.
